Student Rules

1. Phone Eurospeak if you know you are going to be late to school (0118 958 9599) and always phone your guardian/parents if you know you are going to be late home.
 2. Keep mobile phones fully charged and turned on. Always make it easy for your parents or guardian to call you.
 3. If you go out somewhere, travel with friends where you can, and always let your parents/guardian know where you are going and what time you expect to arrive back.
 4. Whenever you leave the school building let your teacher and our admin/reception team know where you are going, and what time you expect to be back.
 5. If you are using a taxi, always dial the company, and don't just catch a taxi from the side of the road. Let your parents or guardian know where you are getting the taxi from and to, and what time you expect to be back.
 6. If using a bus after dark, travel in the front of the bus, near the driver and arrange for someone to meet you at the stop.
 7. Avoid Oxford Road, Whitley Wood and Cemetery Junction areas after 7pm
 8. Have fun and look out for your friends!
